- Tickets will be placed in Will-Call at the Welcome table for pickup day of services.

Service Descriptions

Erev Rosh Hashanah – We will have one service this year, infused with an array of music and liturgy that speaks to our entire community. This service will feature both our Youth/Teen Choir and Band along with our adult Zimriyah Chorale.

Rosh Hashanah Day I and Yom Kippur Morning Family Service – This service will feature the Youth & Teen Choir and Band, as well as informal reflections from our clergy. If you have attended the generational service in previous years, many of the elements will remain. We have made enhancements to the service to be more inviting for families with students grades 2 through pre-B'nai Mitzvah. As in previous years, all generations are invited to join us for this rich service!

Rosh Hashanah Day I and Yom Kippur Morning Late Service – The late morning services will include our Zimriyah Chorale and musicians, as well as a traditional sermon offered by one of our clergy.

Kol Nidrei – As in years past, our two Kol Nidrei services are identical, both featuring Kol Nidrei played on cello and sung by our Rabbi/Cantor and choir, as well as a rabbinic sermon.

Children's Service

To enhance their High Holy Day experience, we are including programming for our kindergarten through 2nd grade students. Programming (class, stories, art projects as well as exclusive children's services) will take place from 8:30 - 10:30 am on the first day of Rosh Hashanah (Monday, September 26) and on Yom Kippur (Wednesday, October 5). Participants will be taken to the Family Service on Rosh Hashanah to hear the blowing of the shofar. Drop off and pick up will take place in the hallway of Room 200.
